PLANNING AND SCHEDULING YOUR EVENTS

- Protocol is paramount and varies country to country
- Sarah Beeching on our team is ex DFID and an expert in protocol
- Accreditation and vetting by PM office needs to be done well in advance: CEPI, delegates, speakers, crew, caterers etc
- Flag sensitivities & family photos: nations feelings towards each other are important
- Eavesdropping and bugging: evermore serious concern, plan according to risk



- Visas applying late pushes up your flight costs and maybe not be granted at all
- If not paying for own flights delegates don't make visa a priority
- Suggest Dummy ticket sent with invite (common practice for travel agents), so visa applied for asap
- India visa applications can only be made 3 months before
- See Visas and yellow fever document for more detail
- Nigerian's require longer visa process for both locations













LOCAL APPROACH

- Ship out minimal Vivace staff from UK
- Quotes from suppliers in Kuala Lumpur and Singapore
- Depending on your needs you may want to consider higher quality camera kit from Singapore
- But if PM in attendance having all KL kit and crew more appropriate
- Malaysia has reasonably high standards of production
- Crew welfare generally overlooked, locally, taking care of a crew will result in far higher production standards
- Music licence is required to play <u>any</u> music
- With PM or Government attendance any entertainment that is considered risqué or culturally inappropriate will not be allowed


DISTANCE FROM AIRPORT

- Islam (official religion) 63%, Buddhism 19%, Hinduism 9%, Christianity 6%
- Government officials likely to observe Ramadan approx 18 February 2026 for 29-30 days
- Ramadan, Chinese New Year and Eid overlap in 2026 a good idea to avoid 17 Feb 23 March
- Other public holidays in **Spring 2026**: Traffic always worse around holidays, especially fast break day
 - Chinese New Year 17-18 February event costs more expensive
 - Nuzul Al-Quran 7 March
 - Eid Al-Fitr 21-23 March
 - Labor Day 1 May
 - Hari Raya Haji 27, 28 May
- Traffic the frequent rain or a car breakdown can bring traffic to a standstill
- Kuala Lumpur is generally considered safe for visitors
- Kuala Lumpur is a vibrant city and International visitors are catered for in international venues/hotels
